Those who attended the 22nd Annual Luncheon in 2014 will remember the lovely family that entertained us; the children and grandchildren of **Elaine Dixon Matuszak**, **Class of 1939**. Elaine was celebrating her 75th reunion of graduating from Alvernia High School. Elaine was so proud of this achievement, she even provided buttons for everyone, including waitstaff, to wear that day. Her entire family was in attendance to celebrate with Elaine.

Due to illness Elaine was unable to attend the 23rd Annual Luncheon this past year and died on June 25, 2015. Some of our board members were able to attend the Memorial Service and we heard about a woman of six boys who had five miscarriages of boys (yes, she could have had 11 boys).

Active in her neighborhood, Elaine, an artistic seamstress, gave young girls and women sewing lessons in her home. She made her own graduation, prom and wedding gowns. She was the authority on types of threads, ribbons, sewing needs and materials. Desiring the best in sewing machines, she possessed three. Elaine also crocheted and knitted. When she was a member of St. Robert Bellarmine's Altar and Rosary Society, Elaine worked on vestments, lace altar cloths, and collected used materials which were then sent to the missions.

Elaine knitted an afghan as a prize for the Alvernia Alumnae Luncheons and always included a bottle of liquor with her donation. Elaine was also grandmother of 18 and great grandmother of 10.

Sister Shirley Patzelt, a dear friend of Sister Kate Brenner, our moderator, may be remembered as the organist/pianist at our Memorial Masses. Sister Shirley lost her more than year long battle with breast cancer this past February, 2015.

ALVERNIA ALUMNAE MAKING A DIFFERENCE.....

<u>Mary Ann Phelan Cahill, Class of 1945</u> died in October 2014. Her niece, Judy Cahill Kagan, Class of 1960, wanted to share the story of her favorite aunt with our alumnae. (It was Mary Ann's great love of and pride in Alvernia that convinced Judy that she too wanted to attend high school there.)

Mary Ann, mother of 11 children and 17 grandchildren, was one of the founders of the La Leche League in 1956. She along with six other women in Franklin Park, IL helped found the advocacy and support group that became La Leche League International. She wrote the first manual for the League after the women decided they could no longer keep up with the demand for information by writing individual letters back to the many mothers asking for help. She was the author of *Seven Voices, One Dream*, an oral history of the League in the words of the founders, *The Heart Has Its Own Reasons,* mothering wisdom for the 1980's and numerous articles. She was an emeritus member of the Board.

She and her small group began an organization that would become a community of mothers guiding and nurturing each other through their parenting journeys; an organization that supports scientific research, sells accessible nursing wear, maintains online forums, and helps millions of parents in over 60 countries. Mary Ann and her husband were leaders in the Christian Family Movement at St. Joseph's in Libertyville. She helped establish the St. Vincent De Paul Society at the Church of Holy Apostles in McHenry where she lived for the past 25 years. Mary Ann was recognized as <u>A Catholic Woman of Inspiration</u> by the McHenry Deanery Council of Catholic Women in 2014.

Judith Wampach Amberg, Director of Saint Viator High School Alumni Relations Emeritus (formerly Sister Peter Lenore, SSSF from 1960-1972) - First of all I commend all of you involved with the Alumnae Association for the work you do to keep your alumnae connected and engaged. I am a former SSSF and have a special place in my heart for all things related to the School Sisters. I was moved when I heard *Make Me a Channel of Your Peace* on your website.

I have worked with several of your alumnae over the years and have always been impressed with their knowledge, talent, energy and generosity of spirit in the ways they serve God's people. One of those alumnae is **Eileen McDermott Manno '69**.

Eileen McDermott Manno '69 of Mount Prospect, IL has been a teacher, counselor, assistant principal and principal at St. Viator's High School in Arlington Hts, IL for 32 years. During her current tenure as principal, the school has been the recipient of two back to back Blue Ribbon Awards. The school's average ACT score has been 26 or higher for the last five years.

At the recent **10th Annual Night of the Lion** at the Stonegate Banquet and Conference Centre, Eileen was the **Night of the Lion** honoree in thanks for her decades of dedication to the school. Eileen thanked the School Sisters in her acceptance speech. Through the honoree video, many other members of the Saint Viator community also thanked and praised Eileen for the difference she has made in the lives of countless young people.

Donna DeNicolo Eckert '69, Fort Wayne, IN. (submitted by her sister Jacki DeNicolo McKay '66)

For the last 2 years Donna has dedicated weekly hours to Kingston Residence (an Assisted Living Community in Ft. Wayne, IN) as a volunteer giving manicures to the ladies, assisting in serving at social functions and transporting residents, wheel chairs & walkers

on 'Field Trips'. She has this passion for collecting aprons and decided to share some with the residents. Along with little nostalgic items tucked into each pocket ad donned in her June Cleaver pearls and earrings she presents what she calls *Apron Chronicles*. Changing aprons and checking each pocket she pulls out a small jar with buttons, a birth-day candle or clothes pin sparking happy memories for these elderly residents (some of whom have dementia/Alzheimer's).

My favorite is when she puts on the apron from her wedding and tells of the Polish Tradition where everyone makes a circle around the Bride and Groom, the veil is removed as an apron is put on designating she is now a wife. During this time everyone sings *Let Me Call You Sweetheart.* This brought a sparkle in their eyes as one, then another, started singing and remembering youthful years of long ago.



Who would think aprons and antique trinkets could bring so much joy? Donna did! And what does she say? "My cup runneth over; so blessed to have Kingston in my life and for the privilege of being able to serve them at this stage in their lives."
