

The Late Sister Maria Crucis (Sister Sandra Olivia Smithson) came to Alvernia for her first assignment as a School Sister of St. Francis in 1956. Those who were fortunate to have Sister as their teacher found her to be a mentor also and many have fond memories of her.

Sister passed away in the place she was born —Nashville, TN on Friday, May 13, 2022 at the age of 96. Sister was the sixth of ten children. She attended Catholic schools founded by Sister Katharine Drexel from first grade through college where she excelled in academics, sports, and peer leadership. After graduation from Xavier University, New Orleans and a teaching fellowship at Fisk University where she obtained a Master's Degree in Literature, she was recruited to be the first woman to host a talk show on Nashville's first African-American radio station, WSOK. The show was called "A Woman Speaks".



In 1954, she answered the internal call to religious life and joined the School Sisters of St. Francis based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Sister had 67 plus years in religious life working in missions in the United States, Central and South America. After leaving Alvernia, she served as principal of a private school in Costa Rica and initiated a pilot education project for poor children in the surrounding barrio that led to public school reform for the entire country. That era has been referred to as "the Golden Age of Sister Maria Crucis".

She has served as an administrator, author, publisher, mentor, teacher, lecturer, negotiator, spiritual leader and visionary. In 1992 Sister Sandra founded Project Reflect, a nonprofit organization in Nashville whose mission is "transforming communities through education and policy reform". She was its Executive Director from 1992 through 2014. After her retirement she continued to work toward excellence in public education for grades K-12 in Tennessee. In recent years, Sister Sandra published several books, many available on Amazon.com with proceeds going to help fund the St. Katharine Drexel Scholarship at Father Ryan High School for academically promising African-American students from low-income families.

Sister Karen Ramey SSSF '61 Most pleased to have had Sister Maria Crucis (Sandra) as my English teacher for 2 yrs. and mentor/friend for many years afterwards. I remember how she took off her "wrist lets" and rolled up her sleeves to play volleyball after school with we varsity team players and Miss Zahm. She enjoyed shooting free shots—in basketball too. Later on, in life after college, I entered the SSSF, kept up with her and visited her in San Jose, Costa Rica where she was a key teacher for the girls at Colegio St. Clare and the Universidad St. Clare. I watched how she influenced the students to be more socially aware of justice and peace and started a project that ran for years even after her return to the states, with the upper grades doing social services as volunteers at nursing homes, poor child care sites, enriching their parish's prayer and youth groups. She continued this influence in the States as well as in Central America. Youth gravitated to her for inspiration. She followed me too as I worked 23 years in Guatemala. I have fond memories of her smile, twinkle in her eye, and her spiritual direction that was right on.

The Late Deacon August "Sonny" Annoreno. For anyone who has attended Alvernia events over the past 50 plus years, you will remember Sonny always present and assisting me, his wife, **Barbara Stefan Annoreno '60** and so many others. Sonny passed away suddenly on April 29, 2022 and the Board thought it fitting, since he's been a presence for so many years among our Alvernia Alumnae, that we include his biography which was in our church bulletin.



Sonny was born in Chicago to a Polish Mother and Italian Father in 1942. Sonny met Barbara where they both worked for a short time at Schaar Scientific which was located in Norridge. They married in 1964 at St Rosalie Church in Harwood Heights. He began training as a machinist, but after a turn of events and a short stint as owners of a White Hen Food Pantry, Sonny became a custodian for East Maine School District 63. He worked there for 34 years and retired in 2005. He was much loved by the teachers and students. It was a perfect fit for the outgoing, kind, and dedicated man he was.

Barb and Sonny became parishioners at Our Lady, Mother of the Church in 1971. From that time on they were involved in parish life in one way or another. Both became Eucharistic Ministers and hosted Disciples in Mission which evolved into bible study for 17 years with the same group. 
