Following is the acceptance speech of Sister Barbara Kraemer, Class of 1959, Distinguished Alumna of 2009, School Sister of St. Francis and Provincial of the United States Province of the SSSF:

Good afternoon, my sisters, Alvernians all. What a wonderful view I have from this podium. I remember what **Sister Vitalis** said when she looked out at us at this luncheon every year for so many years: **REMEMBER GIRLS, YOU ARE ALVERNIA.** 

And that is what we realize as we come to this luncheon each year. Alvernia is not the building. We are Alvernia, and we are here because Alvernia lives in us. We come to keep connected and to share the stories of our lives with one another.

Today, receiving the honor of this award gives me an opportunity to share with all of you a piece of the story of my life, what Alvernia means to me. Let me give three examples that you might also identify with:

- At Alvernia a whole world was opened up to me. We were made aware of the needs of others and invited to reach out to them. I remember going with **Judy Madaj** on the California bus on Sunday mornings all the way down to Contagious Hospital at 32<sup>nd</sup> St. to teach religion to the children there.
- And I think of how the sisters at Alvernia were at the forefront of changes in the universal Church. In senior religion
  class Sister Vitalis taught us that we as laity had an active role in the church, five years before the Second Vatican
  Council.
- Alvernia was a place for all of us--sisters, lay teachers, students, and parents. It was a model of what our society could be. We came from different families and economic backgrounds, from different races and ethnicities. We came to know each other at Alvernia and found a home, a place where all belonged.

The real lesson I learned at Alvernia was that faith and life are not separate, that we are called to "walk the walk" and not only "talk the talk." I just saw a 1962 photo in the Loyola University alumni magazine of a group demonstrating at Lewis Towers because the swimming pool was segregated. Among the demonstrators were seven School Sisters of St Francis from Alvernia. It was the first time that sisters in habit were in a protest march.

The sisters at Alvernia made a difference in our lives because they were there for us. They dedicated themselves to giving us a good education, not only in academics but in faith and in life. They wanted us to be women who could do something with our lives. And they believed in us.

Each one of us is a distinguished alum of Alvernia. Today I want to acknowledge **Nancy Strumin Sugrue** from the **class of** '59. Nancy and her husband John have two sons with muscular dystrophy who have been on respirators for the past 20 years. Recently, their son Bill received his diploma from Indiana University. It took him 21 years of typing with a stick in his mouth. The vocation of a mother is special to begin with, but think of the dedication of <u>this</u> mother to her two sons. Nancy, would you please stand? I am privileged to call you "sister." **YOU ARE ALVERNIA.** 

What different lives we have led. And how united we are as sister-Alvernians. I am grateful for this chance to put into words the meaning of Alvernia in my life and my vocation as a sister.

May the Lord bless you and keep you. May he show his face to you and have mercy. May he turn his countenance to you and give your peace.
